- 1: Which four streets form the boundary of the Port Credit Heritage Conservation District? **Lakeshore, Front, Lake and Mississauga S.**
- 2: In 1889, Thomas Nightingale established a factory to make **bricks** from Port Credit clay.
- 3: **Lloyd Refinery** Company was the first company to refine oil on the Texaco lands?
- 4: In what year did Robert Lynn make the first survey of the village of Port Credit. **1835**
- 5: **Kenoillie Creek** and **Mary Fix Creek** are the two creeks that enter the Credit River along a channel just north of the Go station.
- 6: Eaglewood Boulevard was originally known as **Second Street**.

- 5: Miss E.L. Wright was first **librarian** in Port Credit.
