Commemorative Plaque

This Plaque was placed on July 1, 2010
to Commemorate The Town of Port Credit's 175th
Anniversary

Dedicated to the Community of Port Credit in
honour of its Heritage, Pride and Future

In June of 1835 a survey laid out the village of Port
Credit on the west side of the Credit River,
marking the beginning of a thriving port village
known for stonehooking, fishing, logging, shipping
and heavy industry.

By the 20th century, Port Credit had also
become an attractive destination for tourists, and
continues to be a distinctive lakeside community
enjoyed by residents and visitors.

Port Credit acquired Town status in 1961 and
joined the City of Mississauga in 1974.
