- a Maple Blues Award nomination for "*Electric Act of the Year*".

Max has some new tunes in his bag, soon to find their way on an upcoming CD that's currently in the planning stages. And he's staying on the current path established by "Lesson" – where the roads intersect to form Max's own unique brand of Southern Soul inflected offerings delivered with a whole lot of honesty and commitment.

Max has a new radio show on HAZE FM (www.thehaze.ca) called Sunday Morning Soul on Sunday mornings from 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. The radio station will play new Blues, R&B, Soul

and Jazz. Johnny is also the Program Director for the new CNE Blues Festival called “The Bandshell Bluesfest” at the CNE on Saturday August 21st.
